

GAINESVILLE (AP)—Florida defeated Florida State 58-37 Saturday in a dual swimming meet that wound up the season for both teams.

The victory gave the Gators a 9-0 record for the 1963 campaign and their first undefeated season in 22 years. It was also Bill Harlan's first year as Florida head coach.

The defeat left the Seminoles with a 6-3 mark for the season which included two Gator defeats.

Florida's co-captain, Terry Green, set a varsity record in the 200 freestyle with a time of one minute 51.7 seconds. He made the previous record of 1:52.7 in the Georgia Invitational earlier this season.

Jerry Livingston also had a new meet, pool and varsity record in the 200 butterfly. His time of 2:01.5 bettered his old mark of 2:01.7 set just a week ago against East Carolina.

Florida won the first event, the 400 medley relay, and took a 7-point lead that was widened as the meet progressed.

Florida State won two of the eleven events. Neal Allen ran up a score of 250.20 in one-meter diving and Gene Dayton was the victor in the 500 freestyle.

In a preliminary, Floridas frogmen gained revenge by taking a 53-42 victory over the Baby Seminoles. FSU had beaten the Baby Gators in an earlier meet in Tallahassee.
