

Florida State varsity swimmers swept 11 of 14 first places for 157 points to win the Florida AAU championships at Atlantic Beach last weekend.

FSU's freshmen scored 63½ points to take second place in the two day meet.

Junior John Rangely of the FSU varsity was awarded a trophy as the meet's Outstanding Male Swimmer. Rangely won the 100 yard freestyle, the 100 yard butterfly and swam on the winning 440 yard freestyle relay team.

Dick Acosta set a new AAU indoor record in the preliminary heat of the 100 yard backstroke with a time of 59.7. Acosta also won the finals, ahead of FSU's Tut Heisler and freshman Jack Jaisler.

Preston Howland also set a new record in the 100 yard breaststroke with a 1:06.8 time. Jack Barncastle of the FSU frosh was second.

The Seminole freestyle relay team of Bob Durocher, John Kohnen, Charles Robertson and Rangely took first place over a second FSU team. The Seminole frosh were third.

Only part of the FSU team made the trip to Jacksonville. Six swimmers and two drivers remained behind to practice for the NCAA Championships coming up this weekend at New Haven, Conn.
