

ATLANTA, Ga. — Florida State swimmers won every event here yesterday as they romped past Georgia Tech 77-18.

Biggest surprise of the dual meet was the diving victory of FSU sophomore Bob Cruikshank over firmly favored teammate Neal Allen.

The Seminoles set pool records in the 400-medley relay with a time of 3:56.6 and in the 100 freestyle as Dick Abbott won in 49.8.

FSU freshmen won a double victory, downing the Tech freshmen 76-19 and Georgia Military 72-23.

Varsity and freshmen compete in the Southern Collegiate at Athens today.
