

ATHENS, Ga. — Defending champion Florida State jumped off to an early lead at the end of seven events Friday in the third annual Southern Collegiate Swimming Invitational meet.

The Seminole tankers of Miami-Dade Junior College with Coach Bim Stults totaled 70 three.

points in seven events to 33 for the University of Florida. The University of Miami freshmen stand third with 31 points followed by Georgia with 24, the FSU freshmen with 22, the Florida freshmen with 13 and Mi-

Georgia Tech, Vanderbilt and the Georgia freshmen failed to get on the scoreboard in the first day of action.

Mike Koch headed the Seminoles for the day with a record-breaking performance in the 200-yard breaststroke. His 2:19.1 clocking was a new pool and school record as was FSU's Doug Kruger's time of 2:19.7, good for second.

The Florida State medley relay team of Richard Acosta, John Rangle, Dick Abbott and Kruger snared the event with a 3:43 tie.

Freshmen David Gibson of Florida State recorded a second in the 50 freestyle with a time of 22.2 seconds. John Rangle was runnerup in the 200 butterfly with his 2:06 mark.

FSU took the second through the fifth spots in the one-meter diving. Larry Profumo was second followed by Neal Allen and Bob Cruickshank with FSU freshmen Danny Sirk fifth.

ATHENS, Ga. — Florida State's depth - laden swimming team outdistanced a 11-team field without any strain to cop its second straight Southern Collegiate Invitational Swimming title Saturday .

The Seminoles finished with 129 total points with the University of Miami freshmen second with 63. Florida's frosh team was third with 47, FSU's freshmen fourth with 46 followed by the Florida varsity with 45.

Georgia's varsity was sixth with 38 points, Dade Jr. College seventh with nine, the Miami varsity eighth with five and Vanderbilt ninth with four. Georgia Tech and the Georgia freshmen did not score.

The only Florida State firsts of the day were freshmen Duane McAllister in the diving and the Tribe freshmen 400-yard freestyle relay team. McAllister racked up 260.90 points to edge FSU's Robert Cruickshank who managed 257.25. Larry Profumo was sixth with 230.35.

The 400-yard freestyle relay foursome of Bill Anderson, Jerry Matthews, Ken Palmer, and Sealey Feldmeyer set a new

pool record with a 3:20.7 time. The FSU varsity was second.

Dick Abbott, who has been plagued by a virus all week, managed seconds in the 100 freestyle and 100 - individual medley.

FSU's Tom Lloyd, Charles Robertson and Jim Palmer copped fourth, fifth and sixth places respectively in the 100 free.

In the 100 backstroke, FSU placed Jack Jaisler third, Dick Acosta fourth and freshmen Terry Slichenmaier fifth.

Doug Kruger was second and Mike Koch fourth for the Tribe in the 100 breaststroke.

John Rangely and Jim Mauldin were second and fourth respectively in the 100 butterfly for Coach Bim Stults.

The Seminoles next action is Saturday when they play host to the University of Florida varsity and freshmen.
