

Scoring at will, the Florida State swim team drowned Georgia Tech 50 to 33 at the FSU Union pool yesterday afternoon.

The Seminoles kept the score close by not entering in two events, putting just one man in four events, and turning the diving contest into an exhibition.

The Seminoles won every event they entered. F.S.U.'s top men, including seniors Dick Abbott and Mike Blouin, only swam in exhibitions that boosted up the competition.

Sophomore K. C. Dawson from West Palm Beach turned in another good performance, winning the 200-yard freestyle in 2:02.8. Junior Bob Bell from Lake Worth set a new meet record in the 50-yard freestyle, nipping teammate Jim Matthews in 22.7.

The cool weather kept the times down throughout the meet. There was little doubt in the outcome of the meet when soph Gary Trimble and junior Jim Parker, swept the 200-yard individual medley, to give the home town team a commanding 38 to 6 lead.

From then on, Coach Blm Stults entered only one man in each event, with numerous exhibition swimmers showing their superiority in adjacent lanes. Yet, the Seminoles won the next three events: senior Don Hartke winning the 200-yard butterfly, junior Jim Par-

ker the 100-yard freestyle, and soph Rich MacDuff the 200-yard backstroke.

With the score boosted to 43 to 17, the Seminoles entered no entries in the 300-yard freestyle and the 100-yard butterfly. The Seminoles' 400-yard freestyle relay, consisting of sophomores Rick MacDuff and Preston Howland, the two outstanding swimmers in the meet, and sophomores Bill Matthews and senior Tim Hester, won the final race. MacDuff and Howland had earlier joined fellow soph Terry Maul and Dave Gibson in an easy victory in the 200-yard medley relay.

In a much more important meet, the Florida State swim team defeated a determined Miami-Dade Junior College squad 54 to 21. Outstanding for the visitors was Chuck Dashi who won the 200-yard butterfly and 200-yard freestyle.

The Baby Seminoles won five individual events and the two important relays. Russ Doleman from Tallahassee was the leading scorer for the locals, winning the 100-yard freestyle, finishing second to Rod Gray in the 50-yard freestyle, and anchoring the victorious freestyle relay.

An interesting sidelight to the freshmen meet was the single handed efforts of Miami-Dade swimmer Ray Weeks. As punishment for staying up too late the night before in Gainesville, Weeks was forced to swim all eight individual events. Not only did he accomplish the 1000 yard exhibition, but he swam in both relay events, actually taking the lead at the start of the 400-yard freestyle relay.

The Seminole varsity's next meet will be against the University of North Carolina State in Raleigh on January 27 while the frosh will swim the University of South Florida at home on February 5.
