GAINESVILLE — Florida State's swim team set three records Saturday as it handed a very fine University of Florida team its first setback of the season 56-48. The FSU freshmen made is a double victory, easily whipping the Gator frosh 64-31.

Barry Rich was the hero for the Seminoles varsity, defeating Florida's nationally 4thranked Barry Russo in the 200-yard butterfly with a new meet and pool record of 2:00.4. Russo is ranked 17th in the world.

Rich also got the Tribe off on the right foot in the 400-yard medley relay, the first event of the meet. FSU's Terry Schlichenmaier, who swims the first leg of the event, slipped on the turn and fell well behind the Gator swimmer. However, Richturned in an excellent job from his third leg and regained the lead for Florida State.

The 400-yard medley relay was the event which both teams felt would go a long way in deciding the outcome.

Steve McNerney, a sophomore, surprisingly defeated Florida's Bruce Page, also a sophomore, by more than five seconds in the 1,000-yard freestyle. McNerney's time of 10:50.4 was another pool and meet record.

McNerney also won the 500yard freestyle in record time of 5:15.5.

Others taking first places for the Seminoles were Seeley Foldmeyer in the 200-yard freestyle (1:49.8); Ed Helquist in the 200-yard breaststroke (2:27.0); and Randy Stewart in the diving competition with 253.4 points.

Schlichenmaier came backafter his slip in the openingevent to capture a very important second place in the 200-yard backstroke.

The freshmen simply overpowered the Gator frosh, taking the first two events and never trailing.

Chic Newell led-the Baby
Seminoles, winning the 100yard breaststroke, placing
third in the 200-yard individual medley, and swimming a
leg in the winning 200-yard
medley relay.

Alan Pethel also was outstanding, winning the 100-yard backstroke in a good time of 58.2, and swimming the institle of the 200-yard menley relay:

Other-FSU freshmen taking first places were Jim Harrison in the 200-yard freestyle (1:55.5). Dennis Shields in the 200-yard individual med-ley (2:10.0), Kent Davis in the 200-yard butterfly (:57.8). Lea Clifton in the 400-yard freestyle (4:15.9), and the 400-yard-freestyle relay team of Chip Jones, Shields, Bill Pocock, and Harrison (3:26.3).

Unusual happenings occurred in both the varsity and freshmen meets.

In the 500-yard freestyle varsity competition. F8U's Jim Thompson was denied an almost sure first place finish on an official's error. Thompson was leading by more than a half of a lap on the 16th lap when the error occurred. The official is supposed to sound his gun when two laps of the 20-lap event are remaining for the final sprint by the swimmers. The

official sounded the gun with, four laps to go however, and Thompson started ins sprint, only to give out before the event ended.

Florida State still took the event with McNerney winning but Thompson finished third.

in the freshman meet, what appeared to be a three-way dead heat occurred in the 100-yard freestyle between Florida's Thadd Blanton, and FSU's Jim Harrison and Jun Forsythe. After a concensus balloting, Blanton was named the victor, much to the dismay of the large Florida State following.

The victory gave FSU a 2-0 record, while Florida was left 4-1.

The Seminoles entertain two of the strongest teams in the South this weekend when they play host to North Carolina Friday and N. C. State Saturday. N. C. State was the only team to defeat FSU last year and it has its entire team back. The Wolfpack is rated the top team in the South.
