FINAL SCORE Florida 59, Florida State 54 The University of Florida swimming team crushed Florida State's strong bid for an upset at Union Pool yesterday, with a hairbreadth win the meet's final event—the 400-yard freestyle relay giving the Gators a 59-54 win.

A partisan crowd of 1,500 waited nearly five minutes while the judges and timers deliberated the result of the final leg of the relay between Florida's Andy McPherson and Florida State's Seeley Feldmeyer.

Both swimmers were clocked in identical 3:17.0, but the judges ruled that McPherson reached the wall first.

The meet lived up to its billing as one of the fastest and closest in the history of this fierce rivalry.

Two events in addition to the relay were extremely close. Florida State's Jim Vining pulled off the upset of the day with a finger-length victory over Florida All-America Barry Russo in the 200-yard butterfly.

The 100-yard freestyle was ruled a deadheat between Seminole Feldmeyer and the Gator's Steve Macri.

Five meet, and four pool records were tied or broken during the afternoon.

Feldmeyer was the only double winner of the meet with a win in the 200-yard

freestyle to go with his first place tie in the 100-free.

Florida opened the meet with a win in the medley relay, and then stretched the lead to 8-4 as Russo won the 1000-yard freestyle going away in a new meet and pool record-tying time of 10:43.3.

Following Feldmeyer's win in the 200-yard freestyle, McPherson captured an erm's length win in the 50-freestyle giving the visitors a 17-13 lead.

Florida's high school All-America and AAU national finalist, Mark McKee, setmeet, pool and Florida school records with a 2:01.1 clocking in the Individual medley.

The Seminoles swept the two diving events, placing first and second in both.

Freshman Phil Boggs won the one-meter competition over teammate Howie Acosta with a total of 256.45 points. Ken VonRoenn set new meet, pool, and Florida State records in the three-meter diving with 2.92.5 points. Seminole Randy Stewart was second.

The twin wins gave Florida State its first lead of the afternoon, 32-29 as the secondhalf swimming events resumed.

Vining's upset in the butterfly started the second-half, as the Seminole freshman used a moved up from third place to overtake (Continued on Page 2-C)

Russo in the final lap. Florida State's Bruce Rathman finished third, and the Tribe's lead jumped to 38-32.

Macri and Feldmeyer finished in the dead heat, but Florida picked up a point when? McPherson outdueled Bob Bell for third place in the 100-yard freestyle.

Seminole sophomore Dennis Shiels and freshman Dave Mignano pulled off another big upset, as they outdistanced Florida's

Bob Bridges in the backstroke.

At this point Florida State led the meet 50-38 and needed any combination of seven points in the next two events to clinch at least a tie. (Dual swimming meets rae
