The old saying "by a split second" became a reality for Florida State's swimming team Tuesday as the seminoles opened their season with a 62-48 win over the University of Evansville at Union Pool.

While it did not make a big difference in the out come of the meet, the Seminoles introduced electronic timing to dual meet swimming in the South.

The Kroscope Electronic Timer registers the times for six lanes to one-thousandth (0.000) of a second and also serves as the official place judge. By the meet's fourth event the computer had already proved its worth.

In a finish that, from all appearances, was a tie,



Evansville's Ken Miller received a decision over FSU's Jim Stevens in the 50-yard freestyle. Miller's time as registered by the computer was 23.467 seconds. Stevens pulled in with a 23.487. A stopwatch would have likely clocked both in 23.5.

The meet itself was lopsided.

Coach Bim Stults used many of his young swimmers who will be counted on for badly needed depth in future meets, and gave his more experienced men a relatively easy afternoon.

The Tribe opened with a victory in the 400-yard medley relay with a meet record 3:45.061. Brent Norris and Mark Jenkins added wins in the 1000 and 200-yard freestyle events as the Tribe jumped off to a commanding 21-4 lead.

The Seminoles' Ron Potts set a meet mark in the individual medley with a 2:08.997 showing. Evansville also got into the record breaking act when Steve Cooke cracked the existing 200-yard butterfly record with a 2:08.960 time.

Other Seminole winners were Mike Seelie (100-yard freestyle), Earle Greene (breaststroke) and Lee Plank (500-yard freestyle). Howie Acosta won the one-meter diving competition and the Seminoles did not enter the three meter event.
