GREENVILLE, N.C. — Future opponents of Florida State's swimming team take note — do not let anything seriously upset the Seminoles before your meet.

East Carolina learned the hard way that an unhappy bunch of Seminoles is a fierce Tribe and almost impossible to contend with.

In a meet that from all indications should have been close, Florida State completely dominated the Pirates 72-41 in their own lagoon.

Wednesday after Florida State defeated South Carolina, 63-50, at Columbia the Seminoles made the long journey to Greenville, but when they arrived, the Tribe discovered a foul-up in their rooming plans and had to hunt a new place to stay. And it was already after midnight.

The original plans for meals also had gone awry, so Coach Bim Stults crew had to find new avenues there too.

"The whole thing got the kids pretty upset," said Stults. "I guess after more than 20 years of traveling like this, I have come to take these things more in stride."

"But the kids got mad. I wasn't sure what it would do to them in the meet. Apparently they decided to take their aggressions out in competition."

That they did, as the

Seminoles humbled the Pirates by winning nine of the meet's 13 events.

East Carolina, which has a reputation for always being tough at home, figured to give the Seminoles a battle, since the Pirates had also beaten South Carolina handily.

The vigor with which both teams went after this one was seen in the fact that meet records were toppled in all but two of the swimming contests.

The Florida State medley relay team won the opening event in 3:40.7, not only a meet standard, but also just one-tenth of a second off the FSU school mark.

Mark Jenkins and Jerry Norris then swept the 1000 yard freestyle, Jerger winning it in 10:40.9 for another meet record.

East Carolina won both the 200 and 50 yard freestyle events, but the Seminoles

finished second and third in both so the Pirates were only able to pick up two points.

A sweep in the individual medley by Dennis Shiels and Bill Gest sent the Tribe into the first diving break with a commanding lead.

Phil Boggs captured the one meter diving, followed by Seminole teammate Howie Acosta as the Tribe opened its advantage to 39-13.

With first place finishes in the next three events, the Seminoles clinched the victory and four races were still left.

Dennis Shiels and Tom Gest appeared to have a one-two sweep in the backstroke, but Gest was disqualified for a turn violation.

The same situation held true in the breaststroke when Norm Loges and Steve Driver pulled in one-two for the Tribe. This time, however, it was Loges who was found guilty of an

infraction and the sophomore swimmer was disqualified as was his meet record time.

The Seminoles did pull a final one-two sweep in the three meter diving with Boggs and Von Roenn taking the honors.

"We had a good effort against East Carolina," said Stults. "I just hope it will carry over into Friday's meet with North Carolina State.

"That is the big one. We are going to need a strong effort to beat State. They beat us up here two year's ago and then again at our place last year. There is no doubt about it, they are tough."

There won't be any let up following today's meet with the Wolfpack in Raleigh, as the Seminoles move on to Chapel Hill Saturday to meet North Carolina.
