RALEIGH, N.C.—North Carolina State jumped off to a big early lead, but had to battle for dear life Friday before submerging Florida > State's bid for a swimming upset, 62-51.

The Wolfpack captured the first three events of the meet for a commanding 20-5 lead, but it was short lived as the Seminoles came storming back to go on top 42-37 with just four events to go.

For both squads it appeared to be an uninspired performance as many of the winning times were well below the known standards for the individuals involved.

One Seminole was ready, however. Junior sprinter Dean Jerger captured both the 100 and 50-yard freestyle events. The latter in a new FSU school record time of 21.5 seconds.

For other Seminoles, though, it just was not their day, as time and again they were nosed out by N.C. State swimmers in times well below their norm.

Jerger picked up Florida State's first win in the fifty, and Dennis Shiels quickly followed with another in the individual medley.

Freshman Tom Gest followed Shiels to the wire in the individual medley as the Seminoles closed State's lead

to a single point going into the one meter diving competition.

It was here that the Seminoles got the first inkling that this was not to be their day. Despite a remarkable display by the Tribe's All-American diver, Phil Boggs, the judges awarded the victory to the Wolves' Randy Horton with a total of 306.0 points.

Boggs and Howie Acosta placed second and third as N.C. State clung to its narrow

lead.

The Wolfpack soon found breathing room, however, as

they swept the butterfly. The Seminoles ace freshman flyer, Marc Middleton was not able to match earlier performances. and placed a distant third.

FSU was far from out of it, however. Jerger and Lee Eisinger came back to sweep the 100 freestyle. Shiels and Bill Gest followed with a sweep of the backstroke to put the . Tribe on top.

A sweep of the 500 by N.C. State put the Wolfpack back in front, but the Tribe still had high hopes with the breaststroke, three meter diving and final relay yet to come.

In the breaststroke, however, meet recordholder, Norm Loges of FSU, was off his pace, and the best the Seminoles could do was take a second and third.

Then it was the same story in the three meter diving—Horton—garnered—the win despite a strong showing by Boggs and Ken VonRoenn of the Seminoles.

That meant everything rested on the freestyle relay. Although it was close, N.C. State proved too strong with fresh swimmers and edged the Seminoles for the all important win.

swimmers now head for a stiff test against North Carolina in Chapel Hill this afternoon. It will be the last of four straight

meets for the Tribe.
