Florida State spotted Tulane an early 11 point advantage, then battled back to take a 64-49 win from the Green Wave at Union Pool Wednesday.

Despite the windy and rainy weather, eight meet and two Tulane records fell as the visitors let the Seminoles know they were ready for the meet.

The Green Wave captured the opening medley relay when the Seminoles were disqualified. Then it stretched the lead to 12-4 as Don Speck set a new meet and Tulane school record with a 10:33.862 clocking in the 1000-yard freestyle.

Sam Milne's win in the 200-yard Freestyle gave the Greenies their biggest lead at 18-7. Milne's time was also a meet and school record.

The Seminoles started charging back in the 50-yard freestyle as sprint ace Dean Jerger led a sweep of that event for the Tribe. Jerger was clocked in a meet record 21.918 followed by teammate Jerry Stephens.

Mark Middleton switched from his specialty, the Butterfly, to the Individual Medley and responded with a meet record 2:04.765 clocking, good for another Florida State win.

That closed the Tulane lead to one point at 22-21 and the Seminoles quickly jumped in front with a first and third in the one-meter diving competition. Howie Acosta was first with Buzz Cole third.

Chet Miltenberger, a freshman Butterfly specialist gave the Seminoles another win and established a meet record with his 2:01.006 time in the 200-yard fly.

Tulane captured second and third however, and was still very much in the meet. The Green Wave trailed by only three points, 32-29, with six events left.

The Seminoles found breathing room in the next two events, however. In the 100-yard Freestyle, Jerger and Stevens combined for a one-

three finish. Jergers 48.747 time was another meet record.

Then in the 200-yard Backstroke, the Seminoles' Bill Gest and Dave Smarinsky finished one-two and the Tribe shot to a commanding 46-33 lead.

Florida State's Ed Anderson and Lawton Harrison increased the margin with a first and third in the 500-yard freestyle, before Tulane's Milne captured the 200-yard Breaststroke.

The Seminoles' three meter divers captured first and second, putting the mee well out of Tulane's grasp, and the Green Wave's final win in the freestyle relay was of little consequence.

Wednesday's competition served as a final tune-up for both squads, as they prepared for the Independent Southern Intercollegiates at South Florida in Tampa this weekend.

Last year when the meet was held at Tallahassee, the Seminoles were easy victors and Tulane placed second.
