ATLANTA — Florida State's swimming team opened the new year on the right foot Friday, taking two lopsided wins in a double duel meet at Emory University.

The Seminoles downed Georgia Tech 87-26. and demolished host Emory 98-15.

The Tribe's All-America sprinter, Dean Jerger was "Star of Stars" for the Seminoles as he set a new school record in the 50-yard freestyle with a winning time of 21.2 seconds.

It is an outstanding time, especially for so early in the season. That same time in last year's NCAA championships would have placed Jerger close to third in the finals.

Against Tech the Seminoles captured 11 firsts in the 13 events. Only in the one-meter diving and breaststroke were the Yellow Jackets able to cop victories.

In seven of the events the Tribe "swept" the finish with first and second place finishes. And only in the one-meter did they fail to place two finishers among the top three.

The final tally against Emory was even more lopsided. Florida State captured all but one event
