ATHENS, Ga.—Florida State's swimming team, fresh from its two lopsided victories Friday, nearly took things too easy Saturday, edging upset minded Georgia 57-56.

The meet was not as close as the final score indicated, but Tribe Head Coach Bim Stults almost gave former student Pete Scholle a few too many opportunities during the final stages.

"Things sort of got exciting during the final five or six events," said Stults with a knowing smile. "But all in all I think it was a good meet."

The Seminoles held a comfortable 45-25 lead with

five events remaining, and with 57 points the number needed, appeared ready to clinch it.

With Stults using his younger swimmers freely, Georgia captured three of the last four individual events and almost took the meet into the final 400-yard freestyle relay.

The Bulldogs took a first in the backstroke and then the first two spots in both the 500-yd freestyle and the breaststroke to bring the score to 51-46, FSU, with just the three meter diving and the relay left on the card.

first and a third in the diving. Even with an All-America diving, as the Seminoles have in Phil Boggs, it can be sticky on the road. In addition, Georgia's fine Jeff Muir had already captured the one-meter event.

But Boggs did win the three-meter and teammate Terry Maxhimer captured third to give the Tribe the clinching point.

Until the final few events, the meet was generally uneventful with the Seminoles opening a 28-15 lead going into the first diving break.

The Seminoles had no double winners, as Stults gave nearly every man on the traveling squad an opportunity to enter.
