NEW ORLEANS — Florida State swimmers took first place in seven of 13 events here yesterday to defeat Tulane 60-53.

All-American diver Phil Boggs was then only double winner for the Seminoles, taking first place in both the one and three-meter diving events.

Florida State grabbed the first win in the meet, finishing the 400-yard medley relay in 3:38.6. Swimming in the relay were freshman John Hegert, Chet Miltenberger, Mark Middleton and Dean Jerger.

Tulane took firsts in the next four events, with Boggs breaking the string in the one-meter diving.

Mark Middleton took first in the 200-yard butterfly with a time of 2:00.7.

Dean Jerger won the 100-yard freestyle in 47.6 seconds, and teammate Alan Orendorff placed third.

John Hegert and Bill Gest finished first and second in the 200-yard backstroke. Hegert's winning time was 2:09.

Boggs won the three-meter diving, and Florida State's 400-

yard freestyle relay team finished the meet with first in 3:13.8. Swimming in the relay for the Seminoles were Lee Eisinger, Jerry Stevens, Michael Seelie and Dean Jerger.

The Seminoles will remain in New Orleans today and tomorrow for the Southern Independent Championships, to be held at the Tulane pool.
