

# Tribe Swimmers Suffer First Defeat

NEW ORLEANS—Winning four key events, Tulane University's swim team defeated Florida State 60-53 here Saturday afternoon.

It was the first loss of the season for the Seminoles in five outings and the victory evened Tulane's record at 3-3. FSU will try to get back on the

winning track next Saturday in a triangular meet with powerhouses Alabama and Miami at the Union Aquatic Complex in Tallahassee.

The Greenies captured both diving events, a first and second place in the 200-yard backstroke and the medley relay to pull out the victory.

"We could have won," Semi-

nole swimming coach Terry Carlisle said. "Although we had some excellent swims, I'm disappointed with losing. They had a little more toughness in the key events."

In defeat, a few Seminoles still managed to shine. Freshman Mike Grattan qualified for the National Collegiate

Meet with a victorious 50-yard freestyle time of 21.38. Grattan and teammates Cliff Schlak, Bob Carter and Steve Rosenbaum also qualified for the nationals in the medley relay despite losing to the Tulane foursome.

Schlak also captured first places in two individual events.

He won the 200-yard freestyle in 1:43.2 and upset Tulane All-American Bill Dowler in the 200-yard breaststroke with a clocking of 2:15.16.

Cliff's brother Doug was a member of FSU's winning freestyle relay with a time of 3:12.84. Steve Collins, Steve Meisel and Bob Horne also

swam legs of that victorious relay.

Horne upset Tulane's Mike Reynolds and FSU's Grattan in the 100-yard freestyle with a winning time of 47.61.

Bob Gordon was the only other Seminole victor, winning the 200-yard butterfly in 1:57.4.
