

Tribe swimmers capture 4th win

TAMPA — Florida State's swimming team boosted its winning streak to four as the Seminole tankers left South Florida in a 68-44 wake here Saturday to remain undefeated.

"We are swimming with a lot of confidence," said Coach Terry Carlisle after his team once again struck quickly to control the meet. Florida State won nine of thirteen events while swimming a revised order against the weaker Brahmanas.

Florida State's senior diver Jeff Bauer qualified for the NCAA Championships on both the high and low boards while diving an eleven dive slate against the Brahmanas. Bauer, who is the only diver on Florida State's team, qualified on the one meter board with a score of 471.0 points and on the three meter board for the first time in his career with a

total of 512.25. Bauer scored the only double victory for the Seminoles.

After winning the first three events, Florida State's Mike Grattan was upset by South Florida's Paul Celatto in the 50-yard freestyle. Grattan and Celatto both hit the wall at 21.1, a personal best for Grattan, and forced a judges decision. Celatto got the nod.

Seminole Pete Eunson came back in the next event, however, to claim a first place time of 2:01.0 in the 200-yard Individual Medley for a personal best time in the event.

"Eunson put in a super effort," Carlisle said. "That was a super shocker, but Eunson is a great swimmer and I guess it could be expected that he would give it 100 per cent in any event."
