The Seminole 400-yard free relay team of Steve Allbitton, Jim Hamilton, David Shropshire and Sam Seiple took fourth with a time of 3:03.94 and qualified for the NCAA championships. Allbritton took sixth place in the 100 free in 46.10 and Seiple finished 12 th in the same race in 46.65.
