

Blanked 9-0 in their season opener by Pensacola's strong navy squad yesterday, the Florida State University-tennis team looked forward to the return of their number one player, Herb Quay, for their Friday afternoon battle with Davidson college here.

Quay, who has been ill at his home in St. Petersburg, notified Seminole Coach Don Loucks early today that he expected to be on hand for tomorrow's matches.

Behr scored a 6-3, 6-0 win over Larry Dickson. Richards toppled Sammy Smith 6-0, 6-1 and Angstadt and Vogt each scored decisive wins.
