

# FSU Gets First SEC Net Win

ATLANTA--The Florida State University tennis team, celebrating the return of Dr. Don Loucks as its coach, went after its fifth consecutive win of the season here this afternoon against Emory University. The Seminoles have lost only their opener to Loyola.

Loucks, who missed last season while working on his doctorate at Indiana University, had the pleasure yesterday of seeing his charges knock off a Southeastern Conference opponent for the first time in Florida State history. The Seminoles took four of the six singles matches and two out of three in doubles, to defeat University of Georgia at Athens 6-3.

Jim Berry, janky Sophomore from Bradenton, continued to set the pace for the Seminoles with an 8-6, 6-2 win over Georgia's number one ace, John Glimma.
