

The powerful University of Miami tennis team handed the Florida State University netters their fourth setback of the season here yesterday, by whitewashing the Seminoles 8-0.

It was a complete reversal of form for the Seminoles who had blanked Valdosta State by the same score at the east campus courts on Friday, and only one player, Dan Boda of Tallahassee was able to win a set from the Hurricanes.

Boda, one of the outstanding performers on the Florida State squad all year, defeated Miami's Wes Cash, 7-5 in the second set of their singles match.

The Seminoles' next match will be Florida Southern at the east campus courts next Tuesday.
