Coach Bill Lufler did not even use his No. 1 Hurricane netter, Orlando Garrido, saving him for today's all important clash with Presbyterian College, ranked as one of the better college aggregations in the nation.

Miami won six singles and three doubles from Florida State with all except one match was taken in straight sets. Sal Vincent of Miami dropped a set to Jack Egan of Florida State but won 6-4, 3-6, 6-1.

Al Harum, Jr., holder of the national junior indoor singles crown, played the No. 1 spot for the Hurricanes against FSU and knocked off Hal Schaus, 6-2, 6-1.

In the other singles, Reynaldo Garrido, Miami, defeated Tom Cundy, Florida State, 6-1, 6-3; John Kupferburger, Miami, defeated Shelby Creough, Florida State, 6-1, 6-1 and Jerry Slobin, Miami, defeated Don Wyly, Florida State, 6-1, 6-3.

In the doubles, Kupferburger and R. Garrido, Miami, defeated Cundy and Morgan, Florida State, 6-1. 6-1; Harum and Andersson, Miami, defeated Schaus and Egan, Florida State, 6-2, 6-3; Schaffer and Slobin, Miami, defeated Kennedy and Wyly, Florida State, 6-2, 6-0.
