

FSU Netters Fall To PC

Presbyterian College's well-conditioned tennis team lived up to its advance billing by blanking Florida State's Seminoles 9-0, in the season opener for both schools yesterday.

One of the smoothest tennis squads in the nation, Presbyterian stroked its way to relatively easy victories in six singles and three doubles matches on FSU's varsity court.

It was the first shutout absorbed by Coach Keith Pitchford's Seminoles in 17 dual outings.

Presbyterian ace Allen Morris, second-ranked player in the South and No. 18 nationally, disposed of FSU's high-ranking netter, Hal Schaus, in straight sets, 6-2, 6-4. A junior from

Atlanta, Morris is bidding for a repeat position on the United States Davis Cup team.

With one exception, FSU's lineup was comprised wholly of lettermen that won 13 of 18 matches last spring. Freshman Shelby Brewer of Little Rock, Ark., joined Wyly in a losing doubles effort.

State hopes to register its first tennis triumph Thursday, when Georgia's Bulldogs come to town. The Seminoles meet Auburn here Friday.
