

Senior Hal Schaus dented Indiana's tennis superiority yesterday, but the Big Ten net champs for three years running had too much overall finesse for Florida State's Seminoles, 8-1.

It was the 25th consecutive tennis triumph for the Hoosiers, their third this spring. FSU had a 6-4 record heading into today's East Campus clash with Mississippi.

Schaus, rapidly developing into one of the Southeast's finest young amateurs, surprised Indiana's No. 1 ace, Jerry Parchute, 6-1, 3-6, 6-4. Parchute is a former national indoor boys' champion.
