

Georgia's Bulldogs came from behind here yesterday to defeat Florida State's tennis team 8-3. It was the season's opener for both teams.

The Seminoles, unable to use their strong freshmen because of a recent contractual ruling, had only two lettermen to go against Coach Dan Magill's netters.

Hal Schaus and Shelby Creagh, FSU's one-two punch, won the first two singles events, but the Bulldogs swept the last four singles.

Schaus and Creagh continued their domination over the Georgians by taking the first doubles match, but again Magill's charges took the final two doubles matches.
