

Ohio State's tennis squad got little satisfaction here Monday afternoon after traveling almost the length of the United States, bowing to Florida State's rejuvenated Seminoles, 2-0.

The victory squared the FSU record at 1-1. The Seminoles lost their first match last Friday to Georgia, but in that one the Tribe wasn't allowed to use freshmen because of Southeastern Conference rules.

But it was a different story Monday as FSU coach Keith Pitchford turned loose a promising group of first year men who gave the Seminoles the depth which they've long needed. Hal Schaus and Shelby

Creagh, FSU's only two returning lettermen, achieved their second straight individual triumphs.

Florida State will see action here next against Southern Illinois Wednesday afternoon and Georgia Tech Saturday.
