

Florida State's tennis team was favored to bounce back with a victory over Mississippi State here today after the Seminoles were cooled off yesterday by Florida.

The Gators showed surprising strength to sweep all six singles matches and pull out two of the three doubles events. Florida

pushed its season record to 8-4.
