

Back on the winning track, Florida State's tennis squad went after a second straight victory against Southeastern Conference opposition here today.

Louisiana State was the visitor today, and the Baton Rouge Bengals had hopes of faring better than Mississippi State did yesterday. The Seminoles swept five of six singles matches to upend

the Maroons, 7-2.

Junior Lex Hester came from behind to top Ivan Salas, Mississippi State's South American import, 2-6, 6-4, 6-3, in the day's top match.

The Mississippi State triumph assured FSU of finishing with a much better season than last year, when the Seminoles won only five of 16 matches. The Seminoles stand 6-2 in dual competition this spring.

The Maroon freshmen got a measure of revenge by downing the Baby Seminoles, 2-1, in a yearling match.
