

With junior Rebel Bellamy winning one of the tightest collegiate matches ever played here, FSU's tennis team rolled to its sixth straight triumph, 9-0, over LSU here yesterday.

Bellamy and LSU's Leslie Nicholson, both undefeated going into the match, hooked up in a three-hour thriller in their No. 1 singles scrap.
