

Florida State's tennis team sought to make it two straight triumphs over Georgia's Bulldogs in a duel match on FSU's varsity courts this afternoon.

Good singles balance and strong doubles play paved the way to a 7-2 Seminole victory in the season opener for both teams here yesterday. FSU pulled out four of six singles matches and swept the three doubles scraps.

Rebel Bellamy, playing as FSU's No. 1 man, had to turn on the steam to outdo Joe Manderson in a three-set feature match. Paul Scarpa, junior college graduate from Charleston, S. C., made an impressive Seminole debut with a 6-0, 5-3 nod over Bulldog veteran Scott Henson.

Georgia salvaged the two-man freshman match as the Bullpups blanked the Baby Seminoles, 3-0.
