

Taking all but one singles event and two of three doubles matches, Florida's unbeaten tennis team spoiled Florida State's perfect record, 7-2, here yesterday.

Coach Bill Potter's Gators are 9-0 this season and have won 18 straight matches over the past two years. FSU had won seven matches in a row—its best tennis start since 1949—before yesterday's loss.

Five of the nine contests yesterday went a full three sets. Gordy Smith gave the Seminoles their only singles triumph. FSU's Rebel Bellamy bowed to Florida ace Jim Shaffer in a three-set feature match.

In a companion match, Florida's freshman downed the FSU frosh, 6-1.
