

MIAMI—After 10 years and 12 dual matches, Florida State owns a tennis victory over the Rollins College Tars.

The Seminoles, who had dropped 11 straight matches to the Tars since 1951, defeated Rollins, 8-1, at Winter Park yesterday. Now 12-1 this season, FSU is not expected to fare as well here today against Miami's heavily-favored Hurricanes who set a national record for winning endurance every time they win a match.
