

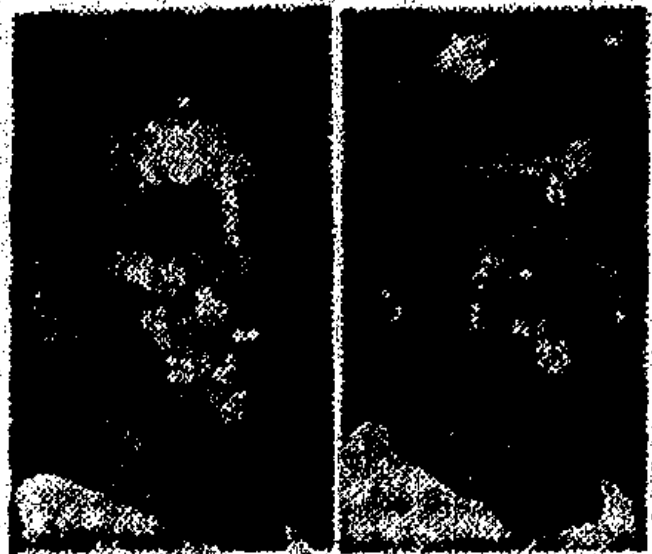
Florida State's tennis team finished the season with an 11-8 record, mainly due to the efforts of the Seminoles' one-two combination of seniors Paul Scarpa and Gordy Smith.

Scarpa, a native of Charleston, S.C., was the squad's No. 1 player, and Smith, of Mansfield, O., the No. 2 man. The two teamed in doubles competition.

Together, the two won 32 out of a possible 40 singles matches. The duo also won 15 of 17 doubles matches.

Although regular season play has ended for the Seminoles, both Scarpa and Smith will compete in the Eastern Intercollegiate Lawn Tennis Championships June 11th through 16th at Colgate University.

Scarpa's outstanding victories probably were against Jim Shaffer of Florida (who went on to win the Southeastern Conference singles title) and Steve Watson

of Furman (who won the Southern Conference singles title).

Scarpa is currently the fifth-ranked singles player in the South, according to the Southern Lawn Tennis Association.

Smith's best match was in a losing effort against John Maloney of Lamar Tech. Maloney, regarded as one of the top collegiate netters in the nation, barely squeaked by Smith in two out of three sets, 13-11 and 7-5.
