

Florida State's tennis team won the first three singles matches, but Northwestern won everything else to record a 6-3 victory Saturday afternoon on the FSU campus. South African Lex Wood opened up by dropping ninth-ranked Marty Riessen 5-7, 6-0, 6-3. Pensacola Don Caton then defeated 14th-ranked Clark Graebner 6-4, 6-1, and Paul Bennett dropped Northwestern's Skip Gage. FSU pushed all the doubles matches to three sets, but could not pull off another win.

The Seminoles, now 6-3 for the season, will meet Florida in Gainesville Tuesday.
