Georgia has won 15 and lost six, Tech has won 11 and lost 5. The match is rated a tossup. Big Mack Crenshaw, No. 6 singles player for Georgia ran his undefeated string to 21 straight matches. The 6-7 junior from Jacksonville now has a career record at Georgia of 53-5-1 after defeating Harry Folsom, 6-0, 6-3.
