Mississippi State Clips Seminole Netters, 7-2

The Mississippi State Bulldogs put down the Florida State Seminoles, 7-2, in a dual tennis meet at the dedication of the new tennis center at Roger Q. Scott athletic field Saturday afternoon.

In the big singles match of the day, the Seminoles' Lex Wood from South Africa defeated Bulldog Graham Primrose, formerly of Sydney, Australia, 6-4, 6-3.

FSU's only other victory of the day came when Pensacolian Don Caton surged to a 1-6, 6-3, 6-3 victory over Orlando Bracamonte. The Bulldogs began to move after the first two singles matches and Tito Echiburo defeated Paul Bennett, 6-2, 6-1; Phil Livingston defeated Paul Burtt, 6-2, 6-4; Hagan Staton came from behind to take Steve Guse, 2-6, 6-1, 6-3; Robert Dean outplayed Don Monk, 6-4, 6-0.

In the doubles matches, Primrose and Bracamonte outlasted Caton and Wood, 6-4, 3-6, 6-2, in a tense, well-

played match.

Echiburo and Staton defeated Bennett and Burtt, 6-4, 6-3, and Livingston and Dean rose to a 4-6, 6-3, 6-3, victory over Guse and Monk.

In freshman matches, Robert Brien of MSU defeated Paul Dezeeuw 6-2, 6-3, and Mach Cameron (MSU) moved to a 5-7, 6-4, 6-1 win over Stew Brunner.

Brien and Cameron defeated Dozeeuw and Brenner, 7-1, 6-3.
