

Georgia Tech handed Florida State its second tennis loss of the season, but the Seminoles salvaged some pride in the afternoon with an easy victory over Navy Saturday as Florida State's Invitational Tournament came to a close.

In another match Saturday, Mississippi State walloped Navy 9-0.

Paul de Zeeuw, the Seminoles' number one player, sat out the morning singles matches with Tech, and Stewart Bruner wilted under the relentless service of Tech's Junior Davis Cupper, Walter Johnson, who hits one of the hardest serves in college tennis.

The Seminoles' Paul Bennett also fell to Tech's other star, Paul Speicher, in three sets.

Steve Guse, Florida State's number five player, won singles matches against Tech and Navy, and also was with Terry Peore the only Seminoles to win in Friday's Mississippi State match.

The Seminoles have three

matches scheduled here this week. They take on Rutgers Monday and Tuesday and Valdosta State Wednesday, all beginning at 2 p.m. at the varsity courts.
