

Favored Miami Hurricanes Take Lead In Florida College Tennis Tourney

All four seeded players in the 1965 Florida Intercollegiate Tennis Championships advanced to the quarterfinals Friday at Cape Coral with the defending champion University of Miami Hurricanes jumping off to an early team lead.

Mickey Shad, number one seed from Miami, eliminated Bill Perrin of the University of Florida, 6-0, 6-2, while second seeded Frank Tutvin of Miami defeated Rick Woltmann of Rollins, 7-5, 6-2.

Gator Withdraws

Third seeded Paul deZeeuw of Florida State University ousted Juan Rubie of Miami, 8-6, 6-1, and number four seed George Shuert of Miami advanced to the quarterfinals at the Cape Coral Yacht and Racquet Club by drawing a bye in the first round and through default over Ron Fick of Florida who withdrew.

The Hurricanes, looking ahead to their showdown match with Trinity University next week, failed to show any substantial weakness despite the absence of their top player Mike Belkin, out with the flu. Their total of 10 points on Friday placed them ahead of FSU (6) and Rollins (5). University of Florida had three points.

Seek Third Trophy

Coach Dale Lewis' Miami squad is after its third consecutive team trophy in the Championships, having won it the first two years of the tournament, begun in 1963.

Upset of the day was recorded by Buck Starbuck, number six player for Rollins, who defeated the University of Florida's number one player, Rick Chase, 7-5, 3-6, 7-5.

Miami 'Canes Take Commanding Lead In Florida College Tennis Tournament

The University of Miami continued its march toward an unprecedented third straight team title in the Florida Intercollegiate Tennis Championships Saturday, with all three of the seeded Hurricane players coming through with victories.

Top - Seeded Mickey Shad reached the semifinals by defeating teammate John Santrock 6-3, 6-1, with second-seeded Frank Tutvin of Miami eliminating Bob McCannon of Rollins 6-2, 6-2.

Fourth - seeded George Shuert, UM captain, also advance with a 6-2, 6-1 triumph over Steve Guse of Florida State University.

Big Upset

Third - seeded Paul de Zeeuw of FSU, 19 - year - old sophomore from East London, South Africa, was upset in a grueling three - set match by Steve Gardner of Florida. Gardner, number two man on the Gator squad, captured the first set of their match 6-4, lost the second set 1-6 and came back to break de Zeeuw's service in the 11th game of the third set for a closing 7-5 win.

Singles and doubles of the 1965 Championships, being held at the Cape Coral Yacht and Racquet Club, will be played today.

Belkin Sidelines

Shad, who jumped to the favorite's role in the tournament because Miami sophomore Mike Belkin is out with the flu, played almost flawless tennis in beating Santrock.

With the first set at 3-3, the stocky and quick Shad reeled off three consecutive games to win. Seemingly growing stronger as compared to Santrock's apparent tiredness, Shad won the second set handily, 6-1.

He then paired with Tutvin to reach the semifinals in doubles, beating Niels Menko and Pete Cowin of Rollins, 6-3, 6-4.

Marathon Match

In the day's longest match which lasted over three hours Stu Bruner and Steve Burt of FSU outlasted Rick Chase and

Bill Perrin of Florida in a 54-game marathon, 6-4, 11-13, 11-9.

The University of Miami led the university division, compiling 16 points to 8 for FSU. Trailing the two leaders were Rollins with seven points and Florida with five.

Singles finals will be played at 11 a. m. today with the doubles finals scheduled for 2 p. m. Team and individual trophies will be awarded following the doubles match.

Miami Wins Florida Tennis Title; Shad Takes Singles

Top-seeded Mickey Shad led a University of Miami sweep in the 1965 Florida Intercollegiate Tennis Championship at Cape Coral Sunday, as the powerful Hurricanes raced off with singles, doubles and overall team honors. It was the

third consecutive year for Coach Dale Lewis' Hurricanes to win the team trophy at the Cape Coral Yacht and Racquet Club and the victory was accomplished this year despite the absence of number one UM netter Mike Belkin, who was out with the flu.

Shad, a sophomore import from Louisville, Ky., had one of the finest days of his young career.

In his morning match, he teamed with Frank Tutvin to defeat Rick Woltmann and Bob McCannon in the semifinal doubles, 6-3, 6-2. He then ousted second-seeded Tutvin in the singles finals, 4-6, 6-1, 6-3, and then came back in the afternoon to pair with Tutvin and beat Miami's John Santrock and Juan Rubio for the doubles trophy, 6-4, 6-2.
