

U-M Crushes Florida State, Takes To Road

University of Miami's tennis team begins the most difficult part of its 1966 schedule on Saturday, invading Trinity at San Antonio, Texas.

The Hurricanes, who finished out their home schedule with a 9-0 triumph over Florida State yesterday, battle Mississippi State Monday at Starkville, Miss., and then close the season May 14 against Rollins before hosting the NCAA championships June 13-18.

Yesterday's victory was the 28th in the last 30 matches for U-M. The other two were ties. Jaime Fillol, U-M's No. 1 singles player, crushed FSU's Steve Guse in a pair of love sets and Miami lost only one set all day in singles. Stew Bruner made a game try against Dave Tate, winning the middle set, 6-4, while losing the other two by 7-5 scores.

The Hurricanes took the first two doubles matches without the loss of a set. In the third doubles match Frank Tutwin and Lucien Sulloway defeated Cliff Murphy and Russ Langstroth, 6-2, 4-6, 6-1.
