FSU Netters Clip Rollins For No. 11

Special To The Democrat WINTER PARK — Florida State's tennis team turned upon long-time tormentor Rollins College on Monday afternoon and posted a decisive 7-2 victory.

The Seminoles, who now have an 11-2 record, interrupt their dual-match schedule to enter three state tournaments.

Rollins, champions of the NCAA's College Division for 1966-67, had defeated FSU four consecutive times before the Tribe won last sesson. Yesterday's outcome was decided by five victories in the opening six singles contests.

Dave Danielson copped the No. 1 match by outstroking Ron Van Gelder 6-3, 6-3. Displaying what FSU Coach Lex Wood called "very poised tennis," Danielson whipped the former No. 3 Davis Cupper of Holland by sending deep forehands into open territory and approaching the net for winning volleys.

Herb Rapp, the rangy Seminole serve-and-volley man, won his match at the No. 2 spot by downing Cliff Montgomery 6-4, 6-4, Rapp bested a player who had lost only three times in two years of college tennis. The Seminole extended his personal 1968 winning streak to 11. John DeZeeuw and Bob Marcher continued to be undefeated as a doubles team for FSU. The tandem earned its tenth straight by overriding Montgomery and Bill Kinne, 6-3, 6-0.

Rapp and Scott Bristol dropped a doubles marathon to Jim Griffith and Bob England, 6-8, 8-6, 9-7.
