FSU Netters Sweep 8-1 Over Auburn

Six consecutive singles victories powered the FSU tennis team to an 8-1 win over Auburn Saturday afternoon, thus achieving the Tribe's 10th straight team success.

Dave Danielson No. 1 Seminole netter, paced the day's play by whipping Steve Davis 6-3, 6-2. Davis had extended the Seminole ace to three sets at Auburn on April 4, but Danielson's crisp backhand placements were more decisive on this occasion.

Herb Rapp extended his personal winning skein to 14 by crushing Jerry Maples 6-0, 6-1 on the strength of his customary flat, attacking service.

Sharp service returns and well-timed volleys propeiled Bob Marcher to a 6-3, 6-1 victory over Billy Hopton-Jones. Danielson and Randy Jobson copped the feature doubles match versus Davis-Hopton Jones by outgunning the Auburn pair, 6-1, 6-4.

Lex Wood's Tribe carries its 14-2 season record to the U. of Miami Monday afternoon for a 2 p.m. match. The duel ranks as a critical one on the FSU schedule, since the Hurricanes are perennially listed among the nation's best 10 college squads.
