FSU Netters Top Rollins For 16th Win

FSU maintained its undefeated home tennis record and upped the season mark to 16-3 by defeating Rollins 5-4 on Monday afternoon.

Possessors of a 24-3 team record before yesterday's battle, the Tars carried FSU to a 4-4 deadlock before John DeZeeuw and Bob Marchtt scored the decisive doubles victory over Bob Kinne and Cliff Montgomery 7-5, 8-6.

An impending rainstorm made postponement seem likely when the Seminoles held a 7-5, 6-6 advantage, but Marcher served swiftly on the slippery surface and DeZeeuw nailed volleys at the net for a 7-6 edge. Then, spurred by DeZeeuw's rapid retrieve of an overhead smash at 15-15, the Seminole pair broke Kinne's service to insure a team victory.

DeZeeuw, Marcher. Scott Bristol, and Al Procopio earned singles points which carried FSU to a 4-2 team advantage before Rollins copped a pair of doubles matches.
