

FSU Netters Close Year With Win

A rousing 8-1 victory over rival Georgia Tech on the home courts Tuesday afternoon swelled Florida State's tennis record to 19-3, the winningest net season in Seminole history.

In downing the Yellow Jackets, FSU buried a squad that had extended the Tribe to 5-4 before losing six days earlier in Atlanta. Seminole singles strength accounted for the rout, all six racquetmen capturing individual matches.

DeZeeuw and Marcher gained their 13th doubles victory of the season in 14 dual matches by downing Bob Speicher and Steve Menke, 9-7, 7-5.

Florida State thus completes its fourth season under Coach Lex Wood, a former star of the Seminoles in 1963-64, with its most dual match victories ever. The 19-3 season mark is the second-best percentage ever recorded. Donald Loucks' 1953 team had a 15-2 mark.
