

Florida State's tennis team will be seeking its first victory ever over the University of Miami this afternoon when the Seminoles and Hurricanes battle at 1 o'clock on the courts behind Tully Gym.

The Hurricanes are undefeated so far this season, although they were tied by Florida.

The Seminoles go into this afternoon's matches with a 15-4-1 record. "We'll be going against one of the finest tennis team's in the country," said Coach Lex Wood. FSU downed Columbus State (Ga.) 7-2 yesterday.

Miami's No. 1 player is Pat Cramer, a junior who hasn't lost a match in his college career. Earlier this season, he handled Florida's ace, Armstead Neely, without too much trouble.

"Cramer is the best college tennis player in the Southeast," said Wood. He'll be facing Florida State's No. 1 player, Dave Danielson.
