CORPUS CRISTI—Florida State rebounded from two earlier losses in the Corpus Cristi Invitational Tennis Tournament to take two wins on the final day Saturday.

The Seminoles overpowered Baylor 5-2 Saturday morning, and then were awarded a default victory when their next opponent, Oklahoma City, was forced to cancel its match because of travel commitments.

Saturday's play ended the Seminoles' preseason slate of nine matches. The Tribe will

open its 1970 season Monday against Georgia Southern on the Florida State courts.

Matches will get underway at 3 p.m.

Herb Rapp paced the Tribe's win over Baylor with a victory in the number one singles match. After the Bear's Jerry Luft took the first set 6-4, Rapp responded with 6-1, 6-2 wins.

Other victorious Seminoles were Al Procopio and Scott Bristol.

The two wins evened the Seminoles tournament showing at 2-2 and left them 3-5 for the preseason Southwest swing.
