CAPE CORAL — The Florida State tennis team shares the Cape Coral Invitational lead with the University of Florida entering today's semifinal and final rounds.

Seminole Herb Rapp will meet Florida's Greg Hilley this morning for the singles title. Rapp defeated UF's Ken Terry 6-4, 6-2 and Paul Lunetta 6-3, 6-0 for his finals berth, while Hilley downed Seminoles Al Procopio 6-3, 10-8 and John DeZeeuw 6-3, 3-6, 6-4.

In doubles competition, two FSU teams reached the semifinals. Rapp and DeZeeuw defeated Lunetta and Will Sherwood in the second round after a first-round bye, while Procopio and Scott Bristol beat Dan Cox and Tim Pateracki of Jacksonville U. and Buddy Miles and Phil Hart of Florida.

Today Rapp and DeZeeuw play Dave Demesquitta and Bob Boland of South Florida, while Procopio and Bristol meet Hilley and Terry.

The Seminole netters tallied 19 points, two ahead of second place Florida. U. of South Florida was third, Jacksonville, fourth and Harding College fifth.
