1985 NCAA TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Singles and Doubles

May 23-26, 1985

Athens, GA

THE EVENT: The 101st NCAA Tennis Championships. Team competition started May 18 and continues through May 21 with individual (singles and doubles) matches beginning May 23rd and concluding May 26th.

FSU PARTICIPANTS: Florida State will send Joey Rive, a 6-1 senior from West Palm Beach, Florida into the 64-man singles draw. Rive compiled a 23-3 record in his senior season at the number one spot for a 95-10 mark over the past three years. He is currently ranked 22nd in the latest Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association poll. His 1985 results are listed on the next page. Rive will also play doubles with Beaconsfield, Quebec, Canada native Geoff Roper. Roper is a 6-0 senior who played number two and three singles for FSU this season and put together a 16-10 mark in 1985. As a team, the two won 21 matches and lost only three at the number one doubles position. They were paired for the first time in the fall and immediately proved themselves by winning the Region III Indoor Doubles Championship and advancing to the National Indoor Doubles Championships in Houston in February.

AT THE METRO: Rive won the Metro crown at number one singles and was named Metro Conference Most Valuable Player. Rive and Roper also won the number one doubles title in leading the team to a second place finish.

FSU HISTORY AT NCAA's: The last time an FSU player or team participated in the championships was in 1971, when FSU coach Richard McKee was still a player for North Carolina. Florida State sent a team to the 1971 event at Notre Dame under Coach Pete Barizon. FSU players compiled enough points in the flighted tournament to finish tied for 16th. Jimmy Connors of UCLA won the singles draw that year while his teammates Haroon Rahim and Jeff Borowiak took the doubles.

THE RANKINGS: Latest ITCA polls had Rive listed as 22nd individually. He jumped from a ranking of 47th in the pre-season poll. The Seminole duo achieved a number nine ranking, the highest ever for any Florida State individual or team.

RECORD-BREAKING SEASON: Led by Rive and Roper, Florida State had its best season in the 37-year history of the sport at the school. The team was ranked in the top 20 for the first time ever and finished the season at number 16. The final dual match record read FSU 22, Opponents 4.

Although he'll only compete in the doubles portion of this event, Roper is a good singles player in his own right...his career singles record at FSU finished at 45-19 for two seasons...transferred to Florida State from Palm Beach Junior College...played number two and three in 1985 with a 16-10 final record...excellent doubles player who won two Metro Conference doubles crowns with different partners in his two years at FSU...won at number two with Marco Abilhoa in 1984 and with Rive at number one in 1985...originally paired with Rive at the beginning of their sophomore seasons, but according to Roper that was a "disaster"...this fall, for some reason, everything clicked...they reached the quarterfinals of the National Indoor Collegiate Doubles Championship in Houston by defeating John Ross and Richey Reneberg of Southern Methodist (6-4, 3-6, 6-4)...Rive and Roper also defeated Burrow and Louw of Miami, Taylor and Johnson of Florida and Acioly and Delseni of South Carolina this season...their 1985 results are listed below...
