The Florida State men's tennis team defeated Trinity College of Ireland 7-2 in a dual match Tuesday at Don Loucks Varsity Courts. The win completed a two-day sweep of the visitors in FSU's first action of the 1988-89 season.

Florida State took four of the six singles matches and the three doubles matches which were played on a pro set format (the first doubles team to win eight matches claims the victory).

For the remainder of the fall tennis season the Seminoles will compete individually in tournaments with the first being the Flagler Invitational beginning Friday in St. Augustine. Florida State will be represented by sophomore Scott Shields.
