**Match Comments:** Florida State advances to Saturday's semifinals at 11:00 AM to face the winner of the Clemson/WFU match...it marks the Seminoles second win over North Carolina since joining the ACC in the 1991-92 season...Braswell, who recorded the clinching match victory, is now 18-13 on the season...Mike Ingham increased his match win streak to nine, and improved his record to 18-3 in dual matches...the team win marks Florida State's third straight trip to the semifinals.
