


FLORIDA STATE HIRES DWAYNE HULTQUIST TO TAKE OVER MEN'S TENNIS PROGRAM

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- Florida State University Athletics Director Dave Hart announced Tuesday the hiring of Dwayne Hultquist as the new head coach of the Seminole men's tennis program.

"Everyone who came into contact with Dwayne during his interview process was impressed with his energy and expertise," said Hart. "We are excited to have Dwayne aboard to lead our program to greater heights."

Hultquist takes over at Florida State after serving the last eight years as an assistant coach at the University of Texas. At Texas, Hultquist's responsibilities included fundraising, scheduling, recruiting and video analysis. He also spent eight years as the codirector of the ITA Collegiate Championships, and was the Director of both the USTA National 16 Zone Team Championships and the University of Texas Elite Tournament Training Camp for the past four years. Hultquist was named the ITA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year in both 1997 and 1999.

During his tenure at Texas, Hultquist helped produce six All-American players. Texas also reached the NCAA Tournament round of 16 all eight years, finished in the national Top 10 the last seven and won its conference championship in six of the last seven seasons. Additionally, he recruited two former top-ranked junior players from the state of Florida - Jack Brasington and B.J. Stearns - to play at Texas.

"My family and I are very excited about joining the Tallahassee community and becoming Seminoles," said Hultquist. "The program has great potential and is backed by an outstanding administration that is committed to excellence. I want to recruit the best players in the state and nationally to take the program to the next level."

Hultquist played collegiately at Penn State University. As team captain in 1986, he earned all-conference honors in both singles and doubles and was an NCAA Tournament qualifier in doubles. Hultquist played professionally in the United States, Asia and Israel before going to work for the United States Tennis Association. From there, he worked at the Nick Bollettieri Tennis Academy in Bradenton, Florida. Prior to joining the Texas coaching staff in 1991, Hultquist served as a graduate assistant at the University of Kentucky.

Hultquist graduated from Penn State with a degree in Speech Communication in 1986. He will take the reigns of a program which has enjoyed 13 straight winning seasons.

Hultquist and his wife, Angela, have an 18-month-old daughter, Devan.

FLORIDA STATE TO CONDUCT NATIONAL SEARCH FOR NEW MEN'S TENNIS COACH

June 8, 1999

Tallahassee, Fla. -- David Barron submitted his resignation as Florida State's head men's tennis coach on Tuesday. Barron, who coached the Seminoles for the past nine years, led FSU to a 13-10 record in dual matches this past spring and a 141-85 dual match record over his career at FSU.

Barron, who will soon complete his PhD in sports management at FSU, said it "has been a wonderful nine years but I feel, all things considered, it is time to embark on a new career. I will truly miss the challenge of taking FSU to a higher level. I wish the best for my successor and Florida State. I will miss FSU deeply."

Florida State Director of Athletics Dave Hart said FSU would engage in a national search to find FSU's new men's tennis coach. "Acceptance of David Barron's letter of resignation as head coach of our men's tennis program is accompanied by appreciation for all of his efforts during his tenure at Florida State," said Hart.

"It is our intent to attract the best tennis coach available as we move into the search process," Hart added.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS SIGNS RECRUIT TIMO VOLMER FROM GERMANY Top Recruit from the Bradenton Academy

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- Florida State men's tennis coach David Barron announced

today the signing of Timo Volmer, a top junior from Germany.

Volmer has been at the Bradenton Tennis Academy for the past four years where he played No. 1 singles for coach Billy Stern. He came to Bradenton after a junior career in his home country of Germany where he was ranked No. 8 on the junior circuit.

"Timo is a fabulous player, and a top recruit, he will be able to make a big impact for us next year," said Barron. "He's a great all-around player who should have the

opportunity to play both singles and doubles for us right away."

Head Coach David Barron has now signed two recruits this spring and is looking to sign probably one more. In April, Barron signed a top recruit from Croatia, Dannie Faranulovic. Volmer and Faranulovic join a young Seminole squad that will consist of one senior, two juniors, and two sophomores next year.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS TEAM IS ELIMINATED FROM ACC TOURNAMENT For second week in a row, FSU loses to Georgia Tech

ATLANTA, GA. -- The seventh-seeded Florida State men's tennis team lost a hard-fought match to the second-seeded Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets for the second weekend in a row. This time however, the 4-2 loss knocks the Seminoles out of the ACC tournament.

Florida State started off the match by winning the doubles point, something they failed to do last Saturday against these Yellow Jackets. Winners for FSU were senior Yvo Niks and junior Mike Ingham at No. 2 and senior Ty Braswell and sophomore Chad Mooney at No. 3. Braswell and Mooney defeated the ACC Flight 3 Champions, Georgia Tech's Sergio Aguirre and Matt Cozad, 9-8. Aguirre and Cozad were 7-1 at No. 3 this season in the ACC. At No. 1 doubles, senior Davidson Kozlowski and freshman Jeff Scarella lost to Georgia Tech's Tim Bibby and Benjamin Cassaigne, 8-6. For Kozlowski and Scarella, it was their third straight loss after starting off with three straight wins together.

In singles, FSU failed to carry over the momentum from winning the doubles point, and lost four of five singles matches before FSU's Ty Braswell and Georgia Tech's Matt Cozad retired with the match in hand for Georgia Tech, 4-2. The lone singles winner for FSU was freshman Noah Schnell, who last week had lost a tough three-setter to Georgia Tech's Sergio Aguirre. Schnell beat Aguirre this time around, 6-4, 6-1. It was Schnell's 10th win of the year, giving the Seminoles six players with over 10 wins on the year.

Senior Davidson Kozlowski lost another tough match against the country's 23rd-ranked player and ACC Flight Champion at No. 1 singles, Benjamin Cassaigne, 7-6, 6-4. In two matches against Tech's Cassaigne in the past week, three of the four sets played have required the winner to win a seventh game.

Florida State drops to 13-10, while the 14-6 Yellow Jackets will move on to face the winner of (3) Clemson and (6) North Carolina. Florida State will return home and wait to hear if they will have the opportunity to play anymore tennis in the upcoming NCAA Regional Tournament. The NCAA Regional selections will be made on Wednesday, May 5th.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS FACE GEORGIA TECH IN FIRST ROUND OF THE ACC TOURNAMENT FRIDAY

ATLANTA, GA. -- The Florida State men's tennis team faces Georgia Tech in the first round of the ACC tournament for the second year in a row. Last year, FSU defeated Georgia Tech 4-1 to advance to the semifinals. These two schools squared off a week ago in Tallahassee with the Yellow Jackets pulling out the victory 6-1.

The Seminoles will change their lineup up a little bit this time around. Last week, the Seminoles had sophomore Chad Mooney at No. 5 and junior Mike Ingham at No. 4. Those two will switch spots in an effort to give the Seminoles better matchups. The other four starters for FSU will have their work cut out for them, as they will face the same opponent who bested them a week ago.

In doubles last week against Georgia Tech, the Seminoles were only able to pull out the match at No. 2. Florida State's Yvo Niks and Mike Ingham teamed to win their 13th match of the season against Tech's Robert Wright and Roberto Suarez.

Should the Seminoles upset the second-seeded Yellow Jackets they will face the winner of #3 Clemson and #6 North Carolina. FSU, 3-5 in the ACC, lost their regular season matches against all three of those schools.

The Seminoles will take the courts in Atlanta on Friday at noon.

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- Florida State University men's tennis coach David Barron announced the signing of Dannie Faranulovic, a top-ranked junior from Croatia.

Faranulovic attended the Bollettieri Tennis Academy for four years. A graduate of Bradenton High School, Faranulovic will become the second FSU tennis player with Croatian heritage. Freshman Marina Raic of the FSU women's team is Croatian as well.

"Obviously getting a world-class player will have an immediate, big impact on our

team," said head coach David Barron.

Faranulovic will join a young Seminole squad next year that will include one senior, two juniors, and two sophomores. With the departure of four seniors from this season's squad, competition for starting spots next season will be wide open. Coach Barron is expected to sign two more players during the spring signing period.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS FALLS TO GEORGIA TECH IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE 6-1 loss drops FSU to 3-5 in the ACC

TALLAHASSEE, FL. – The Florida State men's tennis team dropped it's final ACC match of the season Saturday to the 64th-ranked Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets. The 50th-ranked Seminoles overall record falls to 13-9, while their ACC record dips to 3-5. Georgia Tech improves to 13-6 on the season and 6-2 in the ACC.

This was the first losing ACC season under head coach David Barron. The Seminoles had hoped to ride a three-match winning streak into the ACC tournament next weekend, but now are faced with a possible seventh place finish in the conference.

"We knew what was at stake here, same thing as all season long, we just aren't pulling out the close matches," said Barron.

FSU's only point on the afternoon came from junior Mike Ingham, who won at No. 4 singles to improve his record to 16-9. Ingham defeated Georgia Tech's Romain Coirault in straight sets, 6-4, 6-3. The match was much closer than the final score indicates. Two singles matches went the distance after FSU had won the first set in each of them. At No. 1 singles, FSU's Davidson Kozlowski tested the country's 41st-ranked player, Tech's Benjamin Cassaigne, before dropping the match, 7-6, 7-5.

FSU lost the doubles point for only the second time in their last seven matches. FSU's Ty Braswell and Chad Mooney lost for the first time in four matches at No. 3 doubles. The lone winners for FSU were Ingham and senior Yvo Niks at No. 2 against Georgia Tech's Roberto Suarez and Robert Wright.

FSU awaits their seeding for the ACC tournament next weekend in Atlanta, Georgia.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS TEAM HOST GEORGIA TECH SATURDAY Final home match of the regular season for the Seminoles

TALLAHASSE, FL. -- The Florida State men's tennis team enters their final match of the regular season with a 13-8 overall record and a 3-4 record in the ACC. Their opponent, Georgia Tech, comes into Saturday's match with a record of 11-6 and 4-2 in the ACC.

The 50th-ranked Seminoles are led by a trio of seniors, Ty Braswell, Yvo Niks, and Davidson Kozlowski. Niks and Braswell, join sophomore Chad Mooney as team leaders in overall wins. All three Seminoles have 19 wins heading into the match against the 64th-ranked Yellow Jackets. Kozlowski teams with freshman Jeff Scarella to form FSU's No. 1 doubles team. Freshman Noah Schnell and junior Mike Ingham have provided the Seminoles with excellent depth this season at the No. 4 through 6 positions. Ingham will return next season as the only senior on the squad, Schnell looks to add on to his impressive debut on the college scene by earning his 10th victory of the season on Saturday.

This match has big implications on the seeding for the ACC tournament. The Noles could be seeded anywhere from three to seven. Match time Saturday is 2:00pm at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS TEAM DEFEATS GEORGIA STATE, 4-3 Florida State wins second-straight match

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The 50th-ranked Florida State Seminoles defeated the 57th-ranked Panthers of Georgia State, 4-3. The Seminoles took the doubles point from the Panthers, who have won the doubles point in nearly every match this season. For the Seminoles, it was the fifth time in their last six matches that they have taken the doubles point.

"It was a good win for us, Georgia State has been competing very well lately," said FSU head coach David Barron. Barron also commented on the doubles point, "That set the tone for us, they (Georgia State) had not lost too many double's points all year, it gave us momentum heading into singles play."

In doubles, senior Ty Braswell and sophomore Chad Mooney won for the third straight match together, and senior Yvo Niks and junior Mike Ingham won their 12th match of the season to lead the Noles. The Panthers won the third doubles match as Nicholas Brochu and Karl Lindberg handed FSU's Davidson Kozlowski and Jeff Scarella their first loss this season in three previous matches.

The singles part of the match was split 3-3. For FSU, winners included Mooney at No. 5, Niks at No. 3, and Braswell at No. 2. All three Seminoles are tied for the team lead in overall wins at 19. Mooney snapped a two-match losing streak by defeating Georgia State's Pablo Perez Gras, 7-6, 6-4. FSU senior Davidson Kozlowski lost a controversial match to Georgia State's Karl Lindberg in three sets. The match was called at 5-4 in the third, as the umpire called a game misconduct against Kozlowski and awarded Lindberg the deciding game.

FSU will take the courts for the final time in Tallahassee this season, on Saturday at 2pm against Georgia Tech.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS TEAM PULLS OUT 5-2 WIN OVER FAU Niks seals victory with three-set triumph

TALLAHASSEE, FL. - The Florida State men's tennis team improved to 12-8 on the season as they defeated Florida Atlantic Friday, 5-2. FAU drops to 10-9 on the season and will play Georgia State Saturday here in Tallahassee before returning home.

A leg-weary FSU team saw a 3-0 lead shrink to 3-2 with two singles matches still left to be contested. FSU senior Yvo Niks hung on to defeat FAU's freshman Doug Devreint in three sets to give the Noles their ninth home win in 11 home matches this season. After Niks iced the match for the Seminoles, FAU's Itay Shimony defaulted at No.6 against FSU's Noah Schnell. Schnell was leading the match 7-6, 3-6, 3-0 before Shimony retired. It was Schnell's fourth victory in a row. The other singles victories for the Seminoles came from Ty Braswell and Mike Ingham at No.2 and No.5, respectively.

The afternoon started off well for the Seminoles, winning two out of three doubles matches as the duo of Davidson Kozlowski and Jeff Scarella remained undefeated by winning at No.1. The other doubles victory came at No.3, where Braswell and Chad Mooney defeated FAU's Shimony and Fabio Faerman, 8-3.

FSU head coach David Barron and the men's tennis team paid tribute to former FSU tennis coach and FSU Hall of Famer Donald Loucks before today's match. The match was played in dedication to Coach Loucks, who passed away earlier in the week at the age of 84. A moment of silence was observed before the match in honor of this legendary FSU figure.

The Seminoles return to action on Sunday when they host Georgia State at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center. Match time is 2:00pm.

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The 11-8 Florida State men's tennis team hosts Florida Atlantic on Friday and Georgia State on Sunday. On Friday, head coach David Barron has announced that the team will play in memory of FSU's first tennis coach Don Loucks. Loucks passed away on Tuesday from heart failure. Coach Loucks was inducted into the FSU Hall of Fame in 1985.

The Seminoles are 8-2 at home this season with three matches remaining at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center in Tallahassee. The Tribe is led by a trio of seniors, Ty Braswell, Davidson Kozlowski, and Yvo Niks. Braswell and Kozlowski team to form the No.1 doubles team for FSU and they come into this weekend's matches with a record of 17-10 overall. Freshman Noah Schnell is riding a three-match winning streak and sophomore Chad Mooney leads the team in total victories with 18, one more than Niks.

Match time on Friday is scheduled for 3:30pm. On Sunday, the Seminoles will take the courts at 2:00 pm to face Georgia State. Both matches will be played on the tennis courts named after FSU Hall of Famer and former tennis coach Don Loucks.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS TEAM FALLS TO #25 SOUTH FLORIDA, 5-2 Kozlowski and Scarella upset 38th-ranked doubles team

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The 61st-ranked Florida State men's tennis team took the doubles point, and then lost five out of six singles matches against #25 South Florida on Saturday. The 5-2 loss was only the second home loss of the season for the 11-8 Seminoles.

FSU took the doubles point as senior Davidson Kozlowski and freshman Jeff Scarella, playing in only their second match together, knocked off the nation's 38th-ranked doubles team, USF's Fabio Tintori and Matt Guyaux. Tintori would get revenge later, as he defeated Kozlowski at No.1 singles, 6-4, 2-6, 6-1. Guyaux also got revenge as he halted FSU's Yvo Niks' three-match winning streak, 6-3, 7-6.

The only singles winner for FSU was freshman Noah Schnell, who came back to defeat senior Silviu Nistor at No.6 singles, 4-6, 6-3, 6-3. It was Schnell's third straight victory for the Seminoles.

"Nistor has wreaked havoc on us for four years, it was a big win for Noah as a freshman," said FSU head coach David Barron.

USF had lost to #28 LSU on Thursday, the Bulls bounced back against Florida State to improve their record to 15-4 with two matches remaining before their Conference USA tournament.

FSU returns to the courts on Friday, April 9th, against Florida Atlantic. Match time is scheduled for 3:30pm at FSU's Scott Speicher Tennis Center.

TALLAHASSEE, FL. – The 11-7 Florida State men's tennis team will begin a four-match homestand this Saturday when the Seminoles host the 25th-ranked South Florida Bulls. FSU comes into it's final homestand with a home record of 8-1. The two schools have met 32 times previously, with Florida State leading the series 18-14.

FSU MEN'S TENNIS TEAM FALLS TO NORTH CAROLINA 4-3

CHAPEL HILL, NC. -- In late action Sunday, the 61st-ranked Seminoles lost their fourth ACC match of the season to North Carolina at the Cone-Kenfield Tennis Center in Chapel Hill. The Seminoles now 11-7 on the season, fall to 3-4 in the ACC.

Florida State suffered a huge loss against North Carolina. Senior Ty Braswell injured his back in doubles competition and was forced to miss his singles match. Braswell is FSU's No.1 singles player, with a record of 17-12 this year.

The Seminoles, after losing the doubles point, managed to split the singles matches but that wasn't enough to pull out the victory. The match hinged on the only three set match of the afternoon between UNC's Bjorn Reneken and FSU's Steve Weinstein. Weinstein, playing in only his third dual match of the season, couldn't outlast the more conditioned legs of UNC's Rencken. Rencken clinched the match for the Tar Heels beating Weinstein 3-6, 6-3, 6-2.

Florida State nearly pulled out the doubles point. After getting a win at No.3 doubles by the team of Yvo Niks and Mike Ingham, FSU's No.1 duo of Braswell and Davidson Kozlowski lost a tight match 8-6 to UNC's Ben Elix and Michael Grass. It was only the seventh time in 18 matches this season the Seminoles had lost the doubles point.

Singles winners for FSU were senior Yvo Niks and sophomore Chad Mooney, who each won for the third consecutive match. Freshman Noah Schnell won his second straight match for the Seminoles to improve his dual match record to 3-3 at No.6 singles.

FSU returns home after a 1-1 road trip that saw the Noles beat the 24th-ranked Wolfpack of N.C. State and lose to the 75th-ranked Tar Heels. The Seminoles are 8-1 at home this year and begin a four-match homestand with South Florida on Saturday, April 3rd, at 2pm.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- In late action Friday, the Florida State men's tennis team defeated North Carolina State 5-2 and improved its record to 3-3 in ACC competition.

FSU MEN FALL TO 2-3 IN THE ACC

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The Florida State men's tennis team lost to Clemson University 6-1 on Saturday. The loss drops the Seminoles record to 9-6 overall and 2-3 in the ACC.

FSU's only point of the afternoon came at No.2 singles, where senior Ty Braswell came back from being a set down to defeat Clemson's Pablo Bellagamba 4-6, 6-3, 6-3. Senior Yvo Niks nearly joined Braswell in the win column for the Seminoles, but lost a third-set tiebreaker to Clemson's Ryan Bauer at No.1. Niks battled back after not feeling up to par early on.

"I didn't feel too good early in the match, then after winning the second set 6-0, I started to feel like my game was coming together. It's real disappointing to lose after being up 5-2 in the third set, "said Niks.

Florida State, which normally can count on winning the doubles point, lost all three doubles matches to the Tigers. Coming into today's match with Clemson, FSU had won the doubles point in nine of fourteen matches this season. The closest doubles match was at No.1, where Clemson's Bellagamba and Josh Goffi, the country's 32nd ranked team, needed a tiebreaker to defeat FSU's Braswell and Davidson Kozlowski. Braswell and Kozlowski's record drops to 9-5 at No.1 doubles and 16-9 overall.

FSU returns to action on Tuesday, March 23rd, against UNC-Ashville. Match time is scheduled for 3:30pm. The Seminoles should get a lift as senior Steve Weinstein will make his first appearance in dual match play this season against UNC-Ashville. Weinstein returns from a back injury that has sidelined him this entire season. Last year, Weinstein recorded 17 wins for the Seminoles, primarily winning at No.5 singles.

MEN'S TENNIS TEAM OUTLASTS VIRGINIA, 4-3

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- Florida State evened it's ACC record to 2-2 with an exciting victory over Virginia. The match came down to a third-set tiebreaker at No.2 singles. FSU's Yvo Niks pulled out the heated match against Virginia, with a 7-5 win in the tiebreaker against UVA's John Winter.

Winter had won the first set 6-4, then Niks won the second set 6-3. Midway through the third set, the two competitors realized their match would decide the match for their respective teams. Down 6-5, Niks served to put the match into a tiebreaker. In the tiebreaker, Winter jumped out to an early 2-0 lead, but a double fault at 2-2 gave Niks the momentum. Winter won only one of his powerful serves in the tiebreaker as Niks broke him five times. Winter was equally as impressive as Niks however, breaking Niks four times in the tiebreaker. "In a tiebreaker anything can happen, I just broke him one more time than he broke me," said Niks after an emotional third set tiebreaker for both teams. Niks went on to win the tiebreaker 7-5, and the match for Florida State.

Freshman Jeff Scarella pulled out his match at No.6 against UVA's senior Kent Koch, to set up the Niks and Winter's showdown. In their decisive third set, Koch broke Scarella to even the set at 4-4. Scarella, however, returned the favor and broke back to set up a chance to serve out the match, which he did, winning the third set 6-4. The other singles victory for FSU came at No.4, where sophomore Chad Mooney improved his team leading victory total to 12 this dual match season. Mooney defeated UVA's Tommy Croker 6-3, 7-5.

FSU got things started off well, by earning the doubles point as the No.1 team of Ty Braswell and Davidson Kozlowski and the No.3 team of Yvo Niks and Chad Mooney won for Florida State. MEN'S TENNIS TEAM LOSES TO #4 DUKE, 6-1

CHAPEL HILL, NC. -- The Florida State men's tennis team concluded it's three match road trip with a loss against Duke. The road trip was a rocky one for the Seminoles, as they dropped two of three matches. All three matches were against ACC opponents, therefore the Seminoles return home with an ACC record of 1-2 going into their match with Virginia on Monday, March 15, at 3:30pm here in Tallahassee.

The Blue Devils opened their ACC schedule the way they ended it last year, the defending ACC Champions won five of six singles matches and all three doubles matches. The Seminoles only win came at No.3 singles, where senior Davidson Kozlowski won his third straight match against the nation's 97th ranked player, Andres Pedroso. Kozlowski improves to 3-0 in ACC play and looks to be back on track after suffering a minor back injury earlier in the season. In doubles, Kozlowski and partner Ty Braswell lost a tough match against Dmitry Muzyka and Jordan Wile, the country's 20th ranked team, 9-8.

Other notables, both Mike Ingham at No.4 and Chad Mooney at No.5 had their match winning streaks snapped against Duke. Ingham had his four match win streak snapped by Porter Jones, 6-2, 6-2. Sophomore Chad Mooney saw his five match win streak broken by last season's ACC Champion at No.6 singles, Marko Cerenko. It was Mooney's first loss at the No.5 position in nine matches this season. Mooney's team leading dual match record falls to 11-2.

FSU returns to action on Monday, March 15th, against last season's runner-up in the ACC, Virginia. First serve is at 3:30pm at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles look to get back to .500 in the ACC. Florida State's record is 8-5 overall, and 1-2 in the ACC.

FLORIDA STATE FALLS TO FLORIDA IN MEN'S TENNIS

GAINESVILLE, FL. -- The Florida State University men's tennis team lost it's third match of the season on Wednesday to the University of Florida, 5-2. All three losses this season have come on the road for the Seminoles, and this match was the first of four consecutive away matches for them.

The Seminoles earned their points at No.4 and No.5 singles. No.4 Mike Ingham won his sixth match of the year by defeating previously unbeaten Amr El Sawaf 6-3, 3-6, 6-1. Ingham is undefeated at No.4 in dual match play this year. The other Seminole's point came from sophomore Chad Mooney, who posted his team leading ninth victory with a straight set victory over Trey Adcock, 6-4, 6-4.

In doubles, FSU's top two teams each saw their four match win streaks come to a halt. FSU MEN'S TENNIS TEAM OUTLASTS SOUTHERN MISSISSIPPI MEN, 4-3

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- The Florida State men's tennis team battled the Golden Eagles from Southern Miss for four, heated hours this afternoon and when it was over the Seminoles were left standing with a 4-3 victory and their sixth win of the season. The Seminoles improve to 6-2, while the Eagles drop to 1-5.

With the score tied at 2 a piece, Ty Braswell put the Seminoles up 3-2, with his three set victory over Southern Miss's Rio Kuharski. Then freshman Noah Schnell, playing in his first career dual match, had to retire due to muscle cramps in his legs at the start of the third set. That left the match on the shoulders of sophomore Chad Mooney, playing No.4 for the Seminoles. Mooney forced a third set after dropping the first set, 5-7. Mooney was up 4-3 in the third when Southern Miss's Felix Hutt broke Mooney's serve to even the set at 4-4. Mooney returned the favor and broke Hutt's serve, and then served out the match to clinch the victory for the Seminoles.

With the victory Mooney joins Yvo Niks as the team leader in wins, each with seven. Niks won his match day at No.2 over Mikka Kangas, 7-6, 6-3. The other single's point came from the No.1 position as Braswell defeated Rio Kuharski in a heated, highly controversial match. Braswell improves to 5-3 in dual match play, and 2-0 at the No.1 position this year.

The doubles matches were swept by FSU, the closest match was at No.1 where freshman Jeff Scarella filled in for the injured Davidson Kozlowski to team with Ty Braswell. In their first match together in dual match play, they defeated Kuharski and Kangas 8-5. Kozlowski usually plays at No.3 or No.4 singles position for Florida State, but was held out of action this afternoon due to a sore back.

The Seminoles face Furman University on Sunday, match time is 2pm.

The Lady Seminoles are in action tommorrow against Vanderbilt University. That match was previously scheduled for 11am and was moved back an hour to 12pm.

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- Florida State defeated Troy State and Georgia Southern this afternoon to remain undefeated and begin the season 4-0. Leading the way for FSU All-Time winningest tennis coach, Coach Barron, was No.1 player Yvo Niks who finished the day with two singles victories and two doubles victories. Niks' teammate in doubles Mike Ingham also won both of his singles matches.

In the opening match of the day, Florida State beat Troy State, 5-2. FSU took all three doubles matches and four of six singles matches. Winners included Niks, Ty Braswell at No.3, Ingham at No.4, and Chad Mooney at No.5. In doubles, Braswell and Davidson Kozlowski improved to 3-0 in dual match play this spring, defeating Troy State's No.1 duo, 8-5.

In the second match of the FSU doubleheader, the Seminoles had a clean sweep of the singles matches to enable them to defeat Georgia Southern 6-1. KOZLOWSKI'S TOURNAMENT RUN ENDS IN SEMIFINALS

WINSTON-SALEM, NC -- Davidson Kozlowski was knocked out of the ACC Men's Indoor Championships today, but not before an impressive run through the tournament that landed him in the semifinals.

Kozlowski lost the semifinal match to Duke University's Pedro Escudero in straight sets, 6-4, 6-3. Kozlowski's run earned him some valuable experience as well as some confidence.
