

FSU TRACK TEAM FOURTH

Mercer Wins Title In Dixie Loop

The Florida State University track team, competing in its first championship meet, finished 4th behind Mercer university, Mississippi College and Howard university here today in the Dixie conference track and field meet. Mercer took the loop title with 61 1/3 points, Mississippi college had 53 5/6, Howard 47, Florida State 32 5/6, Oglethorpe 18 and Florida Southern 11.

The FSU Seminoles took two firsts, one second, two thirds, three fourths and one fifth to make a surprisingly good showing in the meet they also picked up fractional points with a tie for third and tie for fifth in events.

Brick Bradford copped the shot putt throw with a heave of 42 feet, 6 inches, for one of the Florida State firsts. Bill Roger took the other individual title with a javelin toss of 171 feet, 9 1/2 inches.

Alford also finished third in the discus throw. Other FSU men to score points in the meet were: Rickey Mahoney, second, 440, and fifth, 880; George Grosskopf, fourth 880; Norman Eubanks, fourth 120 yard high hurdles; Monte May, tie third, high jump; Jim Lohmeyer, tie fifth high jump; Eddie Kucera, fourth, 3 mile run, and Johnny Thomblison, third, broad jump.

Bears Capture Dixie Crown In Conference Track Events

Coach Cowan's Mercer Cindermen Place in All But Discus Tossing

Coach Jim Cowan's Mercer University Bears placed in every event except the discus throw yesterday afternoon in Porter Stadium to compile a total of 61 and 1/3 points and annex the Dixie Conference track championship.

Pre-meet favorite Mississippi College was second with 53 and 5/8

points. Howard was third with 47, and Florida State came in fourth with 32 and 5-6 points. Oglethorpe had 18 and Florida Southern 11 for fifth and sixth places.

In winning the first conference track championship the Bear cindermen captured only one first place and tied for another, but took eight seconds, four fourths, and four fifths for their margin of victory.

Every man on the Bear squad deserves his share of the victory laurels but to sprinted Charlie Davis, captain Dick Benson, and Aubert Kinsaul go the leading roles.

Davis led the Bears in scoring with a tie for first in the 220, a second in the 100, and bringing home the bacon on the third-place relay team for a 10 and 1/4 point total.

Benson, beaten in his specialty, the mile run, by Mississippi College's Hanion Miller, broke the tape in the two-mile run for a nine point total.

KINSAUL SCORES

Kinsaul copped second in both the 880 and two-mile for an eight point total and gave the crowd of approximately 400 their biggest thrill of the afternoon. Trailing 50 yards at the beginning of the last lap of the two-mile, Kinsaul put on a terrific sprint to overtake Mississippi College's James Wasson and to give Mercer a lead in the meet they never relinquished.

Howard's Bill Kremer was the meet's high scorer capturing 15 1/2 points. Oglethorpe's Walt Tanner had 14 while Jesse Meeks of Howard and Howard Greene of Mississippi College had 13 each.

Howard cindermen won six first places and Mississippi College copped four firsts but did not have the seconds and thirds to outscore the Bears.
